On October 8, Barb Chisholm told her story of the Great fire of 1871, also referred to as the Peshtigo Fire, from the perspective of her great-grandmother, Emmerence (Gaspard) Englebert. The presentation was held on the anniversary of the fire that spread thru the Belgian community 146 years ago.

Oral History Project Continues - Walloon Speakers Wanted

The newest interactive exhibit at the Belgian Heritage Center is a collection of video stories told both in English and Walloon by some of our remaining Walloon speakers. They talk about daily life, making a living, what they did for entertainment, religion and how they were not allowed to speak Walloon in school.

The Walloon language was very commonly heard in our area just a generation ago. Many of us have memories of our parents and grandparents speaking it as their first language. Now, Walloon is disappearing both in northeastern Wisconsin as well as Belgium. We at the Belgian Heritage Center are anxiously working to preserve the language as much as possible for future generations to hear. People have estimated that there may still be 100 Walloon speakers spread throughout the Belgian settlement area and Green Bay. Are you one of them? If so, we need your help.
