

They were only allowed in the kitchen with "Cookie". There were workers from Kentucky (Kentucks) and Canadians (Canucks).


Logging Camp possibly Randville, Michigan


Kneeling at far right is the camp owner from Chicago. To his left is Joseph DeBaker, camp manager.


