

Mother Wolf, 9 Pups Bagged Near Fairland

FAIRLAND — A group of hunters killed a mother wolf and her nine pups near here last week after finding them in a hollow tree.

Orbie Bader, Dykesville, was credited with the kill and collected bounties from the Door county clerk's office. Others in the party were Theofil and Goldie Bader, Henry Everhard and his son Roy, and Joe Gasper.

The kill was in the area about one mile south of Fairland, according to the hunters. Roy Everhard had seen the mother wolf on several occasions and had taken shots at her without results. The boy's discovery led to the hunt which resulted in success.

A BRUSH WOLF and her nine pups lost their lives three miles northwest of Rosiere last week Tuesday.

The hunter who finished off the wolf, Orbie Bader, Red River, is shown here holding the 34-pound animal, while Roy Everard strings out the nine pups.

The bounty on a grown wolf is \$20 and the pups brought \$10 each. Others in the picture are Henry Everard, left, and Theophile Bader, and Louis Berger, who points out that he's not a hunter, is at extreme right.

Bader found the tracks in the snow and his dog trailed them to

a hollow oak tree, a short distance, wounding the animal and her young, the wolf, Orbie, but retired to the tree, gathered her pups and waited.

Other hunters in the party were Theofil and Goldie Bader.
