


Submit to Our 2024 Photo Contest

Prayer – the Medicine of the Poor: Early settlers didn't have access to doctors or medicines like we do today so they relied on prayer when they were sick, injured or scared. Julian Romuald, Sr. used his prayer book, Le Medecine De Pauvre, to administer prayers to family and neighbors in the Champion area. The book was originally published in Belgium and brought by the family when they immigrated in 1856. Julian would have said the prayers in Walloon. These sample pages show prayers and procedures from the book, translated to English by Julian's grandsons for a school project around 1950.



O Glorious Virgin Mary, Mother of God, Lady of Angels. Model and pure, hope and comfort of all pure creature. Wound of our Lady and Mother of Angels guard our body and soul. We pray to your precious son who guards. All perils and the temptations by the merit of our bitter endless mortal passion. 


