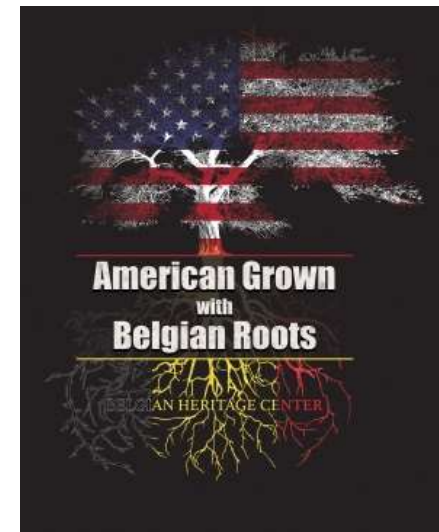

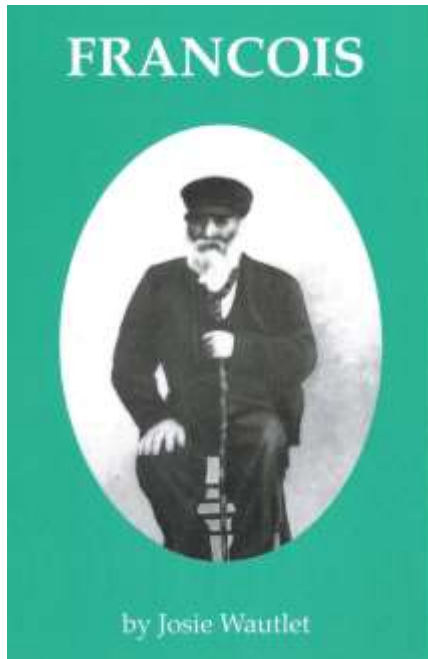

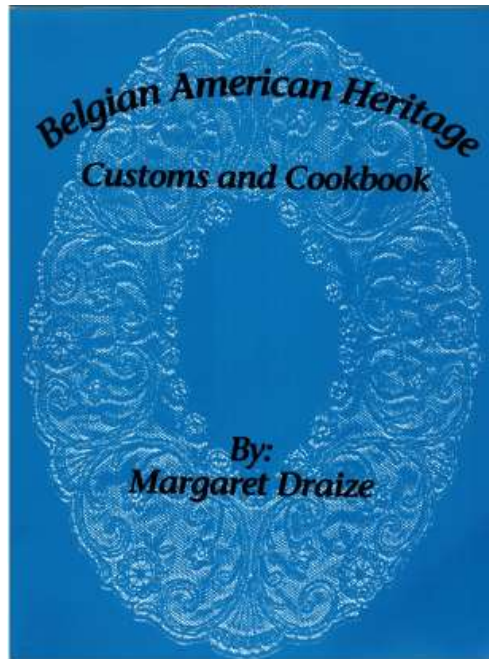

Engaging account of the experiences of first Belgian settlers

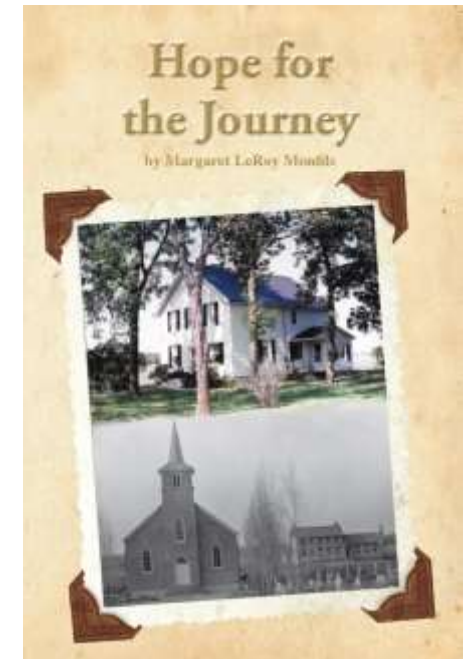

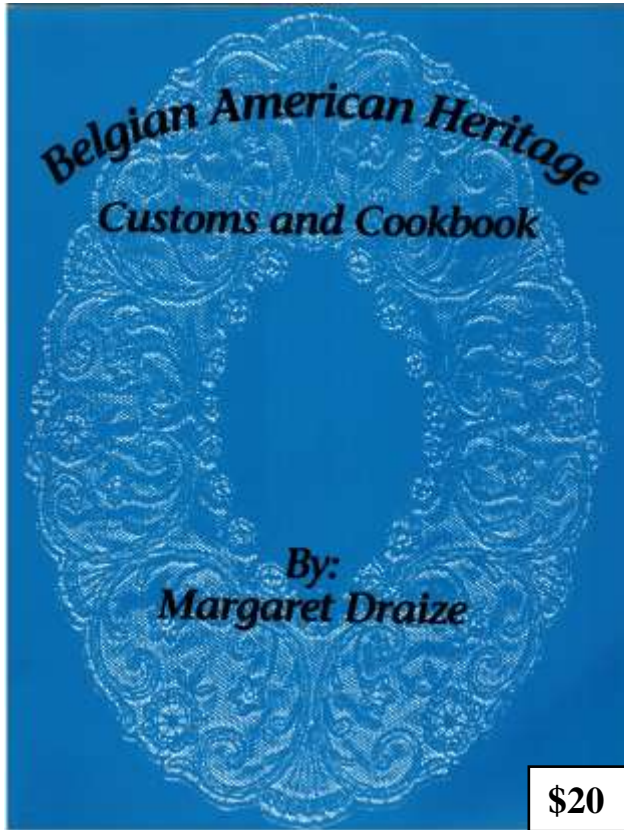


Hope for the Journey | Margaret LeRoy Monfil

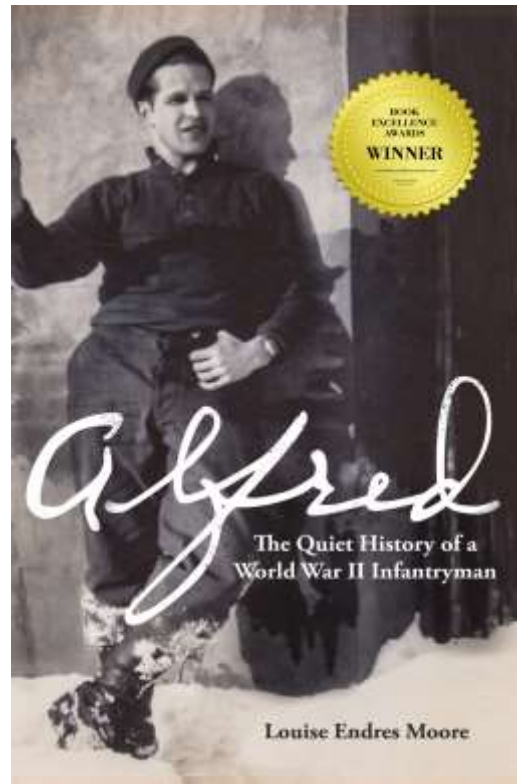
In this 80th Anniversary year of D-Day, BHC is pleased to offer these important historical accounts of heroic WWII service.

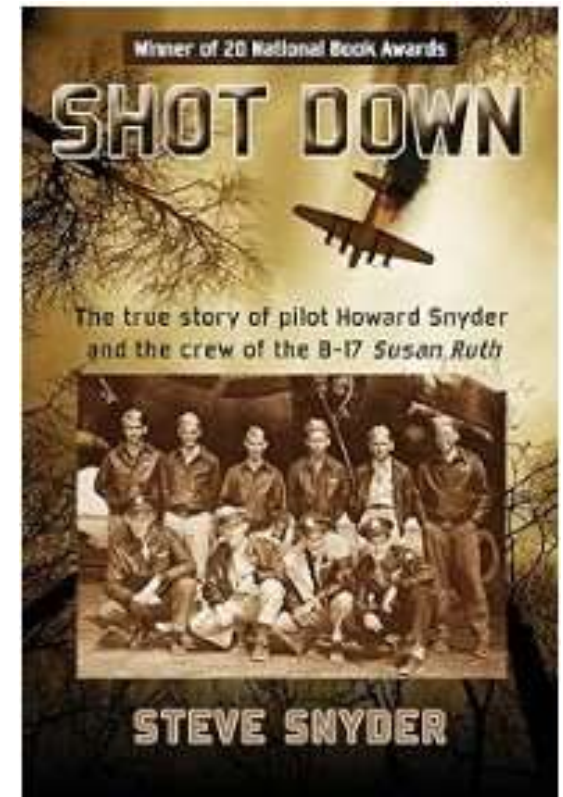

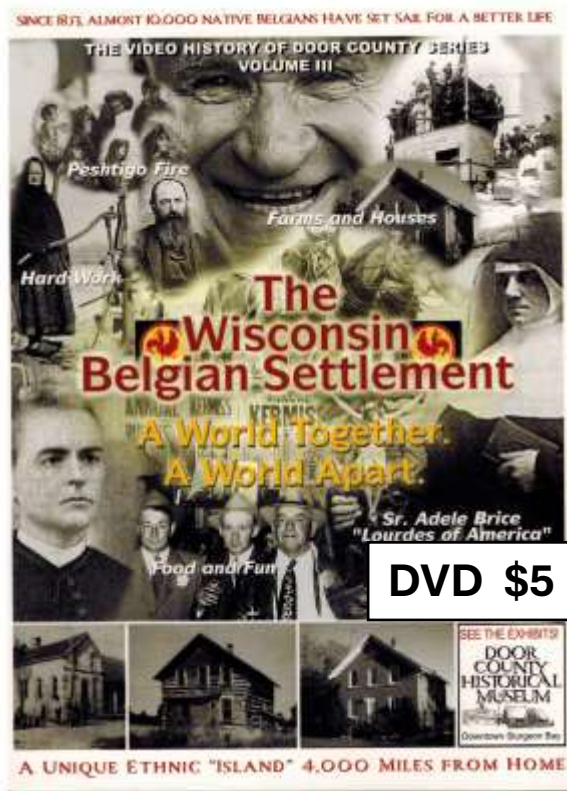
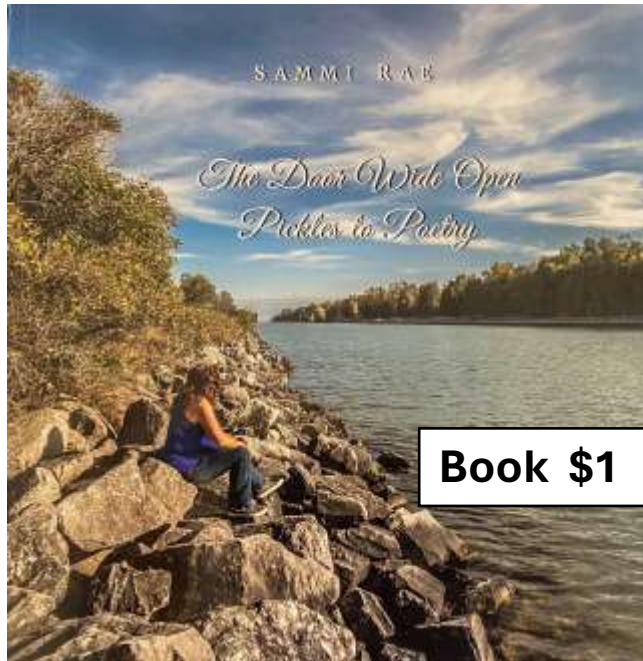
